

FAMILY CONNECTION

Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE | Joshua 3:12–4:7

SESSION SUMMARY

In this session, we see the Israelites finally entering the promised land under Joshua's leadership. And just as the Lord had instructed Moses, he gave Joshua specific instructions too. The Israelites were to take twelve stones from the middle of the Jordan River and set them up on the other side as a memorial to God's faithfulness in that place. Here are the key takeaways:

- God is with us when He calls us (Josh. 3:12-17).
- Spiritual milestones help us remember God's faithfulness (Josh. 4:1-7).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- When has it been hard for our family to remember God is always with us?
- When has our family had to learn to wait on God? Why do you think we struggle so much as a family and as a culture to wait on God?
- What makes it difficult to remember that Jesus is the only way to God? How can we help each other remember this?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Find a clean jar and cut several strips of paper. Grab a few writing utensils and gather around a table. Pray over your time together, asking God specifically to help you remember times when you really saw His faithfulness to your family. Invite each family member to write on separate slips of paper each example that comes to mind. Fold these slips of paper and add them to the jar. When God "shows up" for you in the future, write it down. Add it to the jar. When you've had a tough day and are wondering if God sees you or remembers you, get the jar out, and read all the reminders of His faithfulness to you.
