

Use the following thoughts and questions to have a spiritual conversation as a family. Don't emphasize having the right answer, but focus on spending time discussing the Word as a family.

SCRIPTURE | Joshua 24:14-25

SESSION SUMMARY

This week's session shows Joshua inviting God's people to get rid of false gods and worship the one true God. Joshua vowed that he and his family would worship God alone, and the Israelites committed to doing the same. True worship can't happen without our obedience. Here are the main ideas:

- · God is worthy of our full worship (Josh. 24:14-18).
- · Our worship includes obedience (Josh. 24:19-25).

CONVERSATION QUESTIONS

- · When are each of us tempted to be fake with people? What are some of the "masks" we wear?
- What's so appealing about giving up on something or doing something halfway instead of being all in?
- · How would we currently define worship and obedience?

FAMILY CHALLENGE

Let's talk about legacy. Begin by discussing failures and struggles in your family's legacy. Make sure the information you share is appropriate for your student. Then, discuss some things in your family's history that are beautiful and life-giving. Next, brainstorm the type of legacy your family wants to leave. Consider writing out your legacy in the form of "we will/we are" statements. Write your family's last name at the top of the paper: The [Last Name]. Then, start by writing who you are (this can also be who you hope to be soon!) as a family. These are the "we are" statements. The "we will" statements should describe what you'll do because of who you are. Pray over your statements, asking God to help you leave a legacy that honors Him.
