## **Grad Trip Rules**

- 1. Respect leaders, other students, and yourself.
- 2. No guys in girls' rooms and vice versa.
- 3. Alcohol, tobacco, vapes, drugs, and weapons are prohibited (including pocket knives, mace, etc.).
- 4. Everyone must be in their appropriate cabin by the designated "In Room Time."
- 5. Follow the schedule. Be where you are supposed to be when you are supposed to be there.
- 6. Follow the clothing guidelines. At the core of our dress code is a desire to honor God and each other. We want everyone to be comfortable and to create an environment that will uplift everyone we come across (John 13:35; Ephesians 5:3).
- 7. No public displays of affection.
- 8. Rule of three Have three people with you no matter where you are when out in public or away from the cabins.
- 9. No leaving the cabins once we are settled.
- 10. Be open to what God has for you.

## **Packing List**

Grads are limited to one suitcase/duffel bag and one carry-on or backpack. Please pack for five days and four nights.

### WHAT TO BRING:

- Comfortable clothes for four days (suitable for theme park activities). Include at least two extra outfits.
- Pillow
- Swimwear If a swimsuit does not follow the dress code listed below, students will be asked to change or wear a shirt/shorts over it.
  - Ladies: Modest one-piece swimsuit (full coverage on top and bottom); shorts and a shirt to wear to/from the pool.
  - Guys: Swim trunks (modest length) and a shirt to wear to/from the pool.
- Swim towel
- Three pairs of shoes: close-toed shoes (one pair of shoes you can get wet and one for casual wear) and sandals/flip-flops
- Bug repellent
- Sunscreen
- Sunglasses and a baseball cap or hat
- Rain jacket
- Bath towel and toiletries
- Bible and a pen or pencil
- Medications

- Two garbage bags (for dirty clothes)
- Reusable water bottle (labeled with your name)
- Spending money for souvenirs and meals you have on your own

#### DO NOT BRING:

- Alcohol, tobacco, vapes, non-prescription drugs, fireworks, or weapons (including pocket knives, mace, etc.)
- Valuables that could get lost, stolen, or damaged

### **DRESS CODE GUIDELINES:**

A great go-to for every day is a t-shirt and fingertip-length shorts! The following are **not allowed** on the grad trip:

- Low-cut tops
- Crop tops
- Short shorts (must be fingertip length)
- Sleeveless shirts or tanks
- Yoga pants (can be worn if covered by a long shirt)
- Muscle shirts or shirts that have been cut up
- Clothing with graphics or words that do not honor Jesus
